June is Pride Month!

Members of the LGBTQIA+ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans, Queer, Intersex, Asexual, and others) community experience domestic abuse and sexual violence at higher rates and in uniquely different ways than their cisgender & heterosexual peers. Because the LBGTQIA+ umbrella encompasses many different people belonging to a variety of diverse gender and sexuality minority identities, it makes this a rather complex issue.

While nearly every member of the LGBTQIA+ community faces issues of domestic abuse and sexual violence at higher rates than the general population, some identities experience abuse more than others. The following are factors that add to the complexity of this community issue:

- Sexual violence is experienced at alarmingly high rates for bisexual women and transgender people.
- Gay and bisexual men experience domestic abuse at much higher rates than heterosexual
- Abusers may use the threat of "outing" a partner to obtain extra control.
- Abusers may use negative stereotypes as a form of social and emotional abuse to gaslight victims.
- Abusers of transgender victims may interfere with their transition by destroying medication and gender affirming clothing.
- Lesbian and asexual people my experience increased rates of "corrective" assault, or a form of sexual assault meant to alter the sexual identity of an individual.

Due to anti-LGBTQIA+ bias, many members of the community personally have had or know someone who has had a negative experience with law enforcement or public officials. This may prevent them from reporting abuse. While The Bridge to Hope provides services to people of all genders and sexualities, many service providers only assist cisgender women and, in some cases, display bias against the LGBTQIA+ community.

The Bridge to Hope is committed to aiding all those in need of our services, including our LGBTQIA+ community here in Dunn & Pepin counties. We pride ourselves in the level of awareness and education we have on the specific issues faced by LGBTQIA+ people so we can provide them assistance in the specific and unique ways they require.

Andrea's Journey

Andrea and her son reached out to the TBTH all the way from California with hopes of returning to Wisconsin to be closer to their family. In California, they had been living with Andrea's abusive boyfriend who would often get drunk and become physically and mentally abusive towards her. Andrea was concerned for not only her safety but her child and their pets. Andrea stayed in this abusive relationship because they had two dogs and a bird, which she knew she would not leave behind when she decided to flee. Andrea was worried they wouldn't be able to get into a shelter because of this barrier and experienced denial from multiple shelters because she had pets. Most shelters don't allow animals unless they are certified service animals but here at The Bridge to Hope we accept everyone and their pets. She was relieved when she found out we would accept her and her pets, and left from California after she got off the phone with one of our night staff.

While staying at The Bridge to Hope, Andrea's son was enrolled in school and Andrea was able to transfer her job up here. They unfortunately were denied by many landlords due to past domestic violence situations that had negatively affected their credit. Throughout a few months, advocates were able to assist with communication between Andrea and landlords, which included helping with writing appeal letters to help explain her history and why her credit was affected. After a few more months, Andrea was finally approved for her own place. A huge weight was lifted and she was finally free from her abuser.

Our advocates were also able to help Andrea's son open up and really start expressing himself through making art. Our family and youth advocate was also helpful with navigating the trauma that he witnessed and how to work through the different emotions he was having because of that trauma. Some days were really rough for Andrea but she fought through all of these hurdles for herself, her son, and her pets.
